In the 2025 symposium, noted authors and historians **Hilary Green, Jon Grinspan, Manisha Sinha, Harold Holzer** and **Michael Vorenberg** will discuss aspects of our 16th president's history.

- **Harold Holzer:** *Brought Forth on This Continent: Abraham Lincoln and American Immigration*
- **Michael Vorenberg:** *Lincoln's Peace: The Struggle to End the Civil War*

This year, the 28th Annual Abraham Lincoln Institute Symposium Book Award will be presented to author **Allen Guelzo** for *Our Ancient Faith: Lincoln, Democracy, and the American Experiment*.

With works from the Tony-nominated *Come From Away* and the nationally acclaimed *Big River*, to the world premieres of *Meet John Doe*, *The Heavens Are Hung In Black*, *Liberty Smith*, *Necessary Sacrifices*, *The Widow Lincoln*, *The Guard*, *Grace*, and *Something Moving*, Ford's Theatre is making its mark on the American theatre landscape. Under the current leadership of Board of Trustees Chairman **Phebe N. Novakovic** and through the lens of Lincoln's leadership and legacy, Ford's Theatre endeavors today to advance Lincoln's "unfinished work" with programs and performances that cultivate empathy, encourage dialogue and bridge divides in American life.
