

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

GENERAL INFORMATION

There are four parts of the Ford's Theatre campus: the museum, theatre, Petersen House and Aftermath Exhibits. Your ticket may not include all four parts. Double-check your ticket to confirm which parts of the site you will get to visit.

The Museum and Aftermath Exhibits Include:

- Dark and low-lighting
- Videos with sound
- Artifacts associated with death and violence, including weapons

We welcome you to bring your own sensory comforts. A limited number of sensory kits and noise-cancelling headphones are available to borrow. Please ask a Ford's Theatre staff member to assist you.

ARRIVAL AND CHECK IN

Ford's Theatre is a timed-entry, ticketed site. Every visitor needs a ticket.

While a limited number of same-day tickets are available at the box office on a first-come basis, advance reservations are strongly recommended.

Ticket holders will be asked to line up outside the lobby on 10th street in advance of their entry-time. During high-visitation (especially March-May), the line outside may begin up to 30-minutes in advance. Staff will scan your tickets at the top of the ramp when it is time for your entry.

GETTING TO FORD'S

Ford's Theatre is located at 511 10th Street, NW, Washington, D.C. 20004.

Riding Metro:

- On the Red, Blue, Silver and Orange lines, use the Metro Center station and exit at the 11th and G Streets exit. It is a 3-minute walk to 10th and F Streets.
- On the Yellow and Green lines, use the Gallery Place/Chinatown station and use the Gallery Place exit. It is a 5-minute walk to 10th and F Streets.

Parking:

Limited metered parking is available in the surrounding blocks of Ford's Theatre.

The closest parking garage is located on 10th Street, NW just south of F Street, NW. This parking garage has an elevator that connects to the Ford's Theatre lobby. Weekend parking is a flat rate of \$23. Ford's Theatre does not validate parking.
